# Have you recycled today?

At least 60% of an average household's waste is recyclable. But at the moment, much of this waste is being placed into maroon bins and ending up in landfill.

The changes to your waste collection service will help us meet our target to recycle 50% of our waste and reduce Knowsley's costly Landfill Tax payments to the Government. It will also reduce our waste collection costs by around £500,000 - savings which will help to safeguard other vital Council services.

By recycling your waste you will find that a standard maroon bin, emptied at the new frequency, is adequate for your needs.

We hope the information in this booklet will help you make the most of your recycling service.



### **Reducing your waste**

As well as recycling, it is also equally important that we all try to reduce the amount of waste we produce in the first place. Here are a few tips:

- Visit www.Love Food Hate Waste.com to help you waste less food and save money.
- Reduce the amount of junk mail you receive by registering with the Mail Preference Service. To register, contact the MPS www.mpsonline.org.uk
- Try composting at home. Visit www. recyclenow.com for composting advice and the latest offers on compost bins.
- Using real nappies instead of using disposables can save you money and protect the environment.
- Try recycling your old clothes by either taking them to a clothes bring bank or donating to a local charity shop.

### Waste collection hints and tips

- Please put your bins out by 7am and return them to your property by 12 midnight on your collection day.
- Ensure the bin lid is fully closed and that it's not too heavy to move.
- Do not place non-recyclable material in your grey bin or blue bin as the collection team will not be able to empty it.
- Once emptied, please return your bin promptly to your property and store it in a safe and secure way.
- Place nappies and food waste into bags to reduce smells.
- Save space in your maroon bin by tying bin sacks loosely and squeezing out excess air.
- Put your house number on your bin to reduce the risk of theft.
- Where appropriate, clinical waste collections can be arranged by contacting your doctor's surgery or local health centre.

### Permits

You will need a permit if you are carrying waste in a van, flatbed or trailer (between 2-3 metres long). Permits are free and you can apply for one on the Merseyside Recycling and Waste Authority website www.merseysidewda.gov.uk or call 0151 236 0305.

### What happens to our recycling?

All of Knowsley's waste is treated by the Merseyside Recycling and Waste Authority (MRWA) who run recycling plants at Bidston and Gillmoss. Each type of waste collected has an identified end market and it is estimated that approximately 85% of the total recovered materials are recycled in the UK. ### Your questions answered

#### Why is the council making changes to our waste collections?

A We need to achieve our recycling target of 50% by reducing the quantity of household waste that Knowsley currently sends to landfill each year. The council is facing significant Government funding cuts and needs to reduce its spending. These changes will reduce our waste collection costs by around £500,000 per year - savings which will help to safeguard other vital Council services. Increasing the amount we recycle will also reduce Knowsley's costly Landfill Tax payments to the Government, which from 2014 will be £80 per tonne.

#### Will I have enough space in my maroon bin?

A Yes. By following the advice in this leaflet we will help you recycle as much as possible and reduce the amount of waste you produce. By doing this you will find that a standard maroon bin, emptied at the new frequency, is adequate for your needs.

#### What happens if I have excess waste?

A Extra waste can be taken to the Household Waste Recycling Centres at Huyton or Kirkby or the recycling 'bring sites' across the borough. Details of these can be found in this leaflet or on the council website.

Please remember: We will not remove bags of non recyclable waste left at the side or on top of bins, or empty grey or blue bins containing non recyclable waste.

#### **HWRC Opening hours**

1 October to 31 March: Daily from 8am to 5pm

1 April to 30 September: Daily 8am to 8pm

Closed Christmas Day, Boxing Day and New Year's Day
